Children's Specialty Services

We provide specialty programs for children ages 1 - 18 years

- Parent-Toddler therapy group
For children with speech-language disorders ages 18 months - 3 years
- Reading and Writing therapy
*Individual and group therapy for all ages
Led by Wilson Dyslexia Practitioners*
- FACETIME stuttering therapy
Individual and group therapy for children ages 9 - 16 years (also offered as a summer camp program)
- Augmentative Alternative Communication (AAC) evaluations and therapy

Biofeedback is used to help those with persistent speech sound disorders



Adult Specialty Services

- Northeast Ohio Adults Communicating Together (NEO-ACT)
Therapy and specialty programs for adults with communication difficulties due to stroke, brain injury, Parkinson's disease (PD), and other neurological conditions:
 - Lee Silverman Voice Treatment Program
Treats tremor and reduced loudness of persons with Parkinson's disease
 - Speak Easy/Adult Communication
Group program to increase communication and socialization for post-therapy stroke and other adults with acquired neurogenic conditions.
 - Speak Easy/Adult Communication Caregiver group
Support group for caregivers
