Northeast Ohio Adults Communicating Together (NEO-ACT) is a one-of-a-kind program developed by Cleveland Hearing & Speech Center for adults with acquired communication disorders resulting from stroke, aneurysms, traumatic brain injury and other degenerative neurological conditions.

Individuals with acquired communication disorders are often left feeling isolated and alone with very little resources to improve their quality of life after acute treatment in a hospital and/or inpatient rehabilitation center. NEO-ACT is designed to help improve quality of life through participation in comprehensive programs that provide enrichment for listening, speaking, reading, writing and socialization.
