**Q:** What happens if I miss a class?

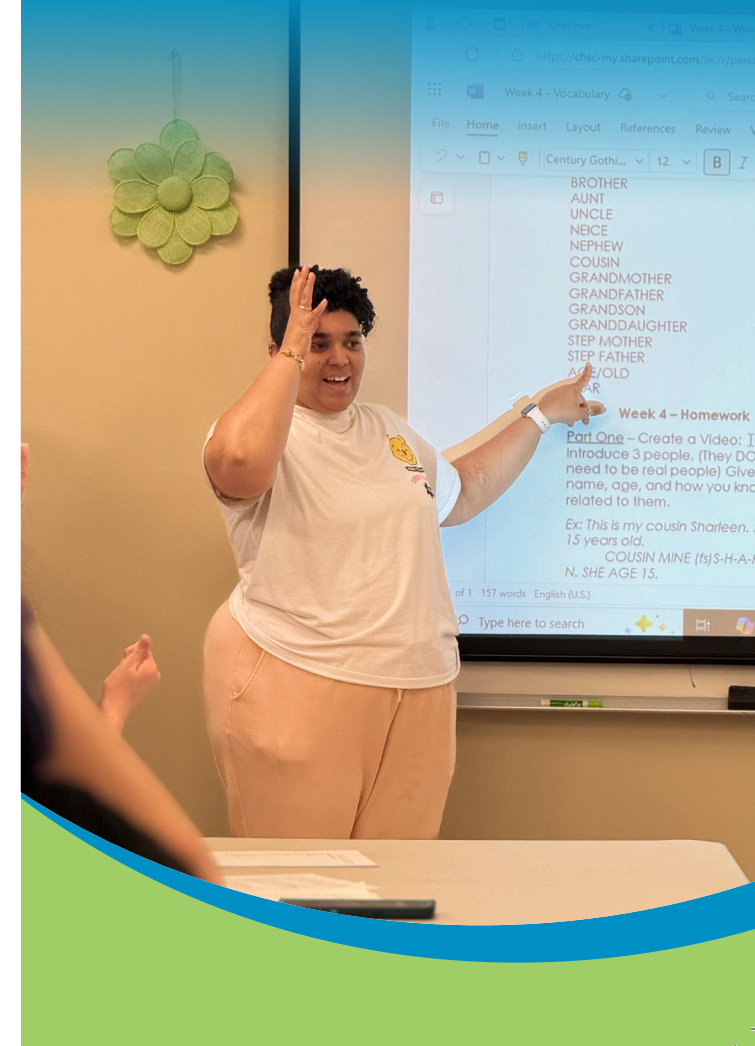

## ABOUT THE CLASSES

ASL takes time to learn and even longer to master. We offer three levels of ASL classes that feature progressive language and comprehension, as well as the opportunity to interact with other students and practice signs.

This is NOT an interpreter training program, but completing these classes will give you a strong conversational knowledge of ASL. (Individual instruction is also available.)

## ABOUT THE INSTRUCTORS

Our instructors are fluent ASL signers with strong ties to the Deaf community and Deaf culture. They help students learn about the diversity of Deaf community members and the challenges they face.

## ASL LEVEL 1

**In Person: Tuesdays, 6–7 p.m.**

**Online: Thursdays, 7–8 p.m.**

This course will introduce students to basic conversational sign language, including beginning ASL vocabulary and Deaf culture and history. Students are taught the manual alphabet and the basic fundamentals of signing. During class, each student will demonstrate their ability to use nonverbal communication with fellow students and with the instructor.

***This class is for those who do not know or know very little sign language.***

## ASL LEVEL 2

**In Person: Tuesdays 7-8 p.m.**

***(following the ASL 1 class)***

**Online: Wednesdays 7-8 p.m.**

This intermediate-level course will expand one's ASL vocabulary. Students will develop receptive and expressive skills and begin to use grammatical features of ASL. They are expected to increase their fluency and accuracy in fingerspelling, numbers and basic conversational signs. The class also continues to examine additional elements of Deaf culture and history.

***This course is ideal for students who have completed ASL 1.***

## ASL LEVEL 3

**Call 216-325-7581 for class information.**

In this advanced course, students will practice higher-level grammatical concepts and vocabulary and continue to grow their understanding of Deaf culture. The class structure includes more complex dialogue and storytelling to improve expressive and receptive skills.

***This course is for those who have completed ASL 1 and 2.***
